He worked as international research and advocacy director for the Open Society Roma Initiatives until December 2013. Prior to that he was director of the Roma Participation Program. He worked on Roma issues with the Open Society Foundations since 1998. He currently teaches the "Roma Rights" course at the Central European University in Budapest. He is a regular contributor and commentator on Roma issues.
